## **US Attorney Praises DC FIU, Investigator**

**(Washington, DC) – US Attorney Jeffrey A. Taylor recently praised the work of the DC Fire Investigation Unit and, specifically, fire investigator Kenneth Kittrell for his work in the arrest and subsequent conviction of a woman who set fire to her uncle’s home in the District.**

**Thirty-seven year old Katrina Holloway was found guilty by a superior court jury for setting ablaze her uncle’s home in the 5200 block of Drake Place, SE after an argument, leaving her uncle and other family members homeless in April of this year. Holloway was also convicted on four other counts, including assault with a dangerous weapon, felony destruction of property, and two counts of felony threats. She faces more than 10 years in prison during sentencing September 30<sup>th</sup>.**

**In announcing the guilty verdict, Taylor expressed his appreciation to the DC Fire Investigation Unit, the Metropolitan Police Department, and particularly praised the work of investigator Kittrell in a statement issued by the US Department of Justice last week.**
